We are pleased that the Mission is offering these professionally done workshops to FAS 2012 participants. There is a fee of \$15 for members of Mission San Luis or \$20 for non-members. #### **Note on Parking at Mission San Luis**

Mission San Luis is a state facility and is open to the public during some of times that FAS 2012 is scheduled. In order to avoid interfering with the public's access, arrangements have been made for FAS attendee parking.

On Friday morning a section of the main lot immediately west (left) of the conference facility will be marked off for FAS attendees. Additional parking, if needed, will be

available in the archaeology lab lot immediately east (right) of the conference facility. Beginning at 2:30 volunteer attendants with orange vests will direct attendees to parking.

On Saturday volunteer attendants in orange vests will be on duty starting at 8 AM until 4 P.M. to direct FAS attendees to parking. After 4 PM the facility is closed to the public and parking for the banquet will be anywhere in the main lot.

### **Hotel Arrangements:**

The Aloft Hotel at 200 N. Monroe St. (corner of N. Monroe and W. Tennessee St.) in downtown Tallahassee has set aside a block of rooms for FAS 2012. Aloft is a fresh and modern boutique hotel with great beds, 42" flat screens that connect to your laptop, a bar and a gym. You will find it an easy walk to the historic Capitol, Museum of Florida History, as well as excellent restaurants and bars. It is a straight shot of 2.5 miles out Tennessee Street to Mission San Luis (about 8 minutes). The Aloft has kindly expanded their shuttle hours to accommodate FAS guests. The shuttle will be available from 7 AM to 1 PM and 3:30 PM to 8:15 PM on Friday and 7:30 to 11 AM and 4PM to 11:30 PM on Saturday.

1. The rate is \$89 plus tax and is available for 3 days either side of 5/9-5/12, 2012.
2. Parking charge is waived.
3. Book early. This rate is available *only* until **April 9, 2012**. After this date reservations will be accepted on a space and rate available basis.
